Warehouse Forklift Training Programs Peoria - Warehouses can be retail, industrial or commercial facilities. Their function can range from retailing bulk products to product distribution. Regardless of the type of warehouse, workers inside warehouse settings must be trained correctly in safety measures related to material handling and storage, loading docks, conveyor systems, and forklifts and pallet jacks. Good housekeeping is vital to a safe and orderly warehouse environment.

The loading dock system is normally build into the warehouse at a height from the ground making it easy to move items coming in and moving out of the warehouse. Personnel will likewise load and unload merchandise and materials from the ramps and elevated docks. Particular attention should be paid to safety habits in this stage. To avoid falls, install yellow striping along the edge of docks and ramps. Pay attention to the area around delivery trucks which are parked at the loading dock, especially the part between truck and dock. Be certain that when unloading, truck wheels are chocked.

To be able to distribute products inside the facility, some warehouses use a conveyor system. These systems are designed with moving belts and wheels that could pose a pinch point hazard. Keep hair and body parts well away from conveyors to prevent injury. Elevated conveyors pose a hazard to personnel below if safety nets are absent. Employees need to know how to stop conveyors in the event of emergency. Be aware of the location of off switches and emergency stop buttons. When servicing conveyors, lock out/tag out procedures are mandatory.

Forklifts and pallet jacks are designed to move materials around the warehouse. Operators of forklifts are required to take training and receive certification. Operators of pallet jacks do not need certification, but should be trained about the equipment. Training programs instruct operators in the correct methods for lifting things and moving them to their assigned place. Neither forklifts nor pallet jacks should ever be made use of to lift or transport workers.

Rack system and storage shelving help to create an orderly and efficient work space if they are sturdy, braced, and allow enough room for people and machines to pass. Slow and careful placement of good is required to avoid accidents caused by products falling off the facing aisle. Aisles must be kept clear by keeping products flat and in the shelving units. Pallets are used for stacking products. They must be in good condition, and palletized products must be baled or shrink-wrapped, whenever possible.

Personal protective equipment (or also known as PPE) must be worn, as appropriate, to protect employees' heads, limbs, feet and hands. Bump caps or hard hats, steel-toed shoes and gloves are common PPE.

Slippery floors pocked with dents and pits present a hazard. Good housekeeping habits involve keeping warehouse docks and floors clear of oil, dirt and debris. The area should be kept clear of garbage, boxes and baling materials.
